

The House Corporation held its annual meeting and Tom Leslie thanked everyone for their continued support of the Golf Outing, Brother-hood Dinner and Homecoming.

Treasurer Corby Thompson reported that after the completion of the Building Fund campaign the chapter's mortgage is \$370,530. The chapter is financially strong and this summer \$14,000 of improvements and repairs were made to the chapter Major items included house. refinishing the woodwork in the Senior Wing hall, along with replacing the flooring, ceiling tiles and lighting in this wing. Bathroom repairs included cleaning regrouting all tile, replacing sinks, some lights and hardware. large trees were also cut down and removed from the property. Routine cleaning of carpets, the Great Hall and Dining room floors was also done.

Drew Watson '98, Delta Delta's Consul gave a chapter update and Phil Steele '77, the chapter advisor, noted that contributions to the Alumni Support Program totalled \$14,775 with over 475 brothers contributing. These funds support the Delta Delta Data and all alumni events.

Purdue and an Indiana professional association have recently honored David Craig '68 for his ongoing contributions to the field of athletic training. In 1993 the Indiana Athletic **Trainers** Assn. named "Professional /Clinic Trainer of the Year" and in 1995 he was inducted into the Indiana Athletic Trainers Assn. Hall of Fame. Purdue's School of Liberal Arts honored Brother Craig earlier this year as one of four Distinguished Alumni in ceremonies held at Purdue.

David has been with the NBA's Indiana Pacers during his 26 year professional career as the athletic trainer and team administrator. His dedicated effort has helped make the Indiana Pacers one of the top teams. He has also committed his energy to designing a student athletic training clinic in Indianapolis, developing certification guidelines for athletic trainers and holding leadership positions on the Indiana Athletic Trainers Assn. and the NBA's Trainer's Executive Committee. He was chosen in 1984 and 1985 as the trainer for the NBA All Star game for the Eastern Conference team.
