Mark Herrmann Joins Purdue Hall of Fame

Former All-American quarterback Mark Herrmann ΔΔ'80 was inducted into the Purdue Athletic Hall of Fame in September. Mark came to Purdue as the throwing portion of the Carmel Connection, which included Bart Burrell $\Delta\Delta$ '80, who continued to be Mark's favorite receiver during their playing days from 1977 to 1980. During this period Mark led the team to a 33-13-1 record. Mark finished his career as Purdue's career passing leader. Mark earned Big Ten MVP, first team All Big Ten, and All-American honors his senior season. In addition he was the Most Valuable Player in three consecutive bowl games, the 1978 Peach, 1979 Bluebonnet and the 1980 Liberty.

Upon graduation Mark was chosen as one of the top picks in the 1980 NFL draft. During his eleven year career he played for the Denver Broncos, San Diego Chargers, Los Angeles Rams and Indianapolis Colts.

Mark, who now resides in Indianapolis with his wife, Susie, and their three children, participates in the annual Delta Delta Alumni Golf outing and states, "that he benefited from his days at Delta Delta because it was important to get the whole college experience - athletic, social and academic." Mark stays close to Purdue football and this fall was the guest speaker at the Annual Purdue Football Kickoff Luncheon where he told the players to trust the new system, forget about the past, and begin now to make their own tradition of winning. Now we know why the Boilermakers are doing so well this vear.

All the brothers at Delta Delta are proud of Mark's accomplishments and we wish him the best.

Keith Krach '79 was honored at Grand Chapter this summer as Delta Delta's 24th Significant Sig. Keith's certificate and picture join a distinguished group that began with George Ade, John T. McCutheon and Booth Tarkington and also includes Gerald Hines, Ralph Weiger, Hank Stram, Chuck Weaver, Bruce Harreld and 14 other alumni who have made their mark in their professional field.

Keith was recognized for his record of successful leadership in the fields of computer technology and robotics where he has created new companies to pioneer the development of innovative software products. He is current Chief Executive Officer of Ariba Technologies, after serving as Chief Operating Officer of Rasna Corporation, a successful mechanical design automation software company.

Brother Krach began his career after graduating from Purdue and Harvard's Business school with General Motors and their robotics group. As a founding team member of GMF Robotics, Keith served as general manager, national sales manager and the youngest Vice President of any GM operating division.

Keith who runs his companies as very close knit groups, states that the "ideals of Sigma Chi and the lessons learned at Delta Delta have been by far the biggest contributors to anything that I have achieved in my professional career". As the 1979 International Balfour Award winner. Keith is still very active with our international Sigma Chi organization. He has served for the past three years as head of the Leadership Training Board which conducts the Leadership Training Workshop each summer. Keith also is a regular visitor to Delta Delta and has had a chance to meet many of the undergraduate brothers where he continues to exemplify the ideals of our fraternity and sets an example for each of us to follow.


