CLASS OF '80 HONORS MEMORY OF BROTHER McCRAY AT 20TH REUNION

The highlight of Homecoming 2000 was the 20th Reunion of the Class of '80. Eighteen members of one of Delta Delta's most closely-knit classes returned to renew their close friendships and to honor the memory of their pledge brother Robert McCray who passed away in 1993. During this special weekend Lafayette area brothers Jim Rush and Jim MacDonald hosted this group. Friday evening the group met and partied at the Rush's as they caught up on old times. Saturday the Class of '80 met at

202 Littleton for a pregame fire-up before heading over the Ross Ade Stadium. Following the game the 20 year class reconvened at the Chapter House to dedicate a memorial to Brother McCray. This monument will serve as a street marker and a continuous reminder of the spirit of brotherhood that bonds this class together. John Pierce orchestrated this memorial service that also included Brother McCray's wife, Carla, and his two daughters, Graham and Calais.

House Corporation Announces Mortgage Burning Campaign

At its annual Homecoming meeting Delta Delta House Corporation President Tom Leslie '68 announced plans to conduct a fund raising campaign that will eliminate the current mortgage on the chapter house. The goal of this program is to raise \$330,000 over the next six months. This campaign was the result of input received from a group of brothers in attendance at Delta Delta's 125th Anniversary gathering this summer. As a group of 50 or more brothers reflected on the chapter's future, it was evident that our venerable 88 year-old chapter house was in need of significant refurbishing. The consensus of the group was to 1.) Create a short-term campaign to retire the current mortgage, and 2.) Develop a comprehensive plan to review our future options for the chapter house.

An initial walk through of the chapter house by an architect has already taken place and a preliminary assessment should be presented in the next few weeks. The goal of the architectural review is determine how we can best upgrade the **See Mortgage Burning... Page 2**

Delta Delta House Corporation Report

The Delta Delta House Corporation held it's annual meeting on September 27 at Homecoming. Updates on the House Corporation's activities were presented by Tom Leslie '68, House Corp. President, Phil Steele '77. Chapter Advisor, and Travis Bonnell '01, Consul. Tom reported on the work done on the chapter house over the summer in preparation for the 125th Anniversary Celebration. This included refinishing the Great Hall and Dining Room floors; painting walls in the dining room, entrance foyer and balcony; replaced lighting, ceiling tiles and the stools in the Ladies Head; rebuilt closets in rooms 1, 13, 14 and 15; painted the outside window frames on the west and south sides of the house; and repaired the Great Hall fireplace.

Phil Steele reported on the Alumni Relations efforts. These included publishing three Delta Delta Datas, and hosting the Brotherhood Dinner and Homecoming. The 2000 Alumni Dues campaign netted \$16,137 from contributions by 461 brothers.

Consul Travis Bonnell noted that there are 65 undergraduates living in the house this semester with another 12 living out-of-house. The chapter also recently inducted a pledge class of 26 young men. Scholarship standing had also significant improved over the past semester as the chapter moved to 15th out of a total of 42 fraternities.

The House Corporation also elected two new members to the House Corporation Board -- Tony D'Eramo '89 and Bob Burlas '86.

HORIZONS WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHT OF BROTHERS' SUMMER

This summer Delta Delta brothers Dean Seeger '02 and Mustafa Jamal '02 got the opportunity of a lifetime when they were chosen to attend Sigma Chi's Horizons workshop. Horizons is a leadership and character development program that is open to all undergraduate Sigma Chi's from every international chapter. Brothers Seeger and Jamal were among the lucky 128 brothers selected to attend this year.

Horizons was conducted in two sessions, both in early July and Brothers Seeger and Jamal were fortunate enough to get space in the same session. The program was held at the Snowbird Ski and Summer Resort outside Salt Lake City, Utah. Our Delta Delta brothers spent a week in the beautiful Wasatch Mountains where they had the opportunity to learn and grow as character/value based individuals as well as leaders.

Delta Delta alumni Keith Krach '79, James Cole '98, Brian Craig '98 and Brad Nihls '99, also participated in Horizons this year as facilitators. The undergraduate brothers were placed in groups of 7-8 with one facilitator assigned to each group. The program itself was very intense. Each day, the groups went through challenging exercises that pushed them out of their comfort zones as individuals and as a team. Later in the day, the team would meet with their facilitator and discuss what they learned as well as give each other feedback.


Highlights of the week were when teams tackled a high ropes course and when we all took a tram ride to the top of one of the highest peaks in the Wasatch range. As each brother sat and watched the sun set they exchanged jokes and told stories of brotherhood and what they hoped to accomplish in the future.

Both brothers Jamal and Seeger feel they will be forever indebted to Sigma Chi for this amazing experience from which they have greatly benefited and learned so much.

BREES '01 LEADS BOILERMAKERS

Sixty four yard touchdown pass; 1:55 remaining on the clock; Purdue 31, Ohio State 27. With three TD passes and 455 passing yards, this last minute victory typified the Drew Brees we have all come to know and appreciate. His neversay-die attitude was never more evident following his fourth interception which was returned to the Purdue 2 yard line. Ohio State took the lead at 27 - 24 with only 2:10 remaining in the game. Fifteen seconds later Drew found the streaking Seth Morales (the son of Tom Morales '75) with a 64 yard strike that clinched the victory and kept Purdue on top of the Big Ten and in the running for its first Rose Bowl appearance since Bob Griese led the Boilers to Pasadena in 1967.

Drew Brees '01 has shown both on and off the gridiron that he is the consummate player and person that all Sigma Chi's can be very proud of. With all of his All Big Ten and All American recognition, Drew's selection as the first recipient of the Socrates Award, demonstrates best his commitment to his sport, his education, his community and his fraternity. This award is given to the college athlete who best embodies "mens sana in corpore sano" or "strong mind in a strong body". Drew's football accomplishments through the Ohio State game include Purdue career marks in pass attempts (1567); pass completions (957); completion percentage (.611); passing yards (11,022); passing touchdowns (86); and total offense (11,836). His numbers for pass attempts, pass completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns and total offense are also Big Ten

records. Drew has also rushed for 13 TD's and caught two TD passes for a total of 101 touchdowns to date. In his march to the top of Purdue's record book, Drew has displaced fellow Delta Delta brothers Mark Herrmann and Jim Everett in each category. Herrmann noted in a recent Indianapolis Star article that, "You can't pass the baton to any better guy than Drew Brees". With Delta Delta's lineage of great quarterbacks, Bob DeMoss, Bob Griese, Herrmann and Everett, Drew commented in the same Star article, "It became funny: guys would say, 'Look you become a Sig and all this happens". If Drew wins the Heisman Trophy he would accomplish something his esteemed peer group has not. Griese finished 2nd in 1966, Herrmann 4th in 1980, and Everett 7th in the 1985 Heisman balloting.

Drew has maintained a 3.41 GPA in the School of Management and leads the Gentle Giants program at Klondike Elementary School. In addition he has given his time to the American Heart Assn.'s Stop Smoking campaign, the United Way, and numerous local speaking engagements. Although he does not live in the chapter house, Drew eats lunch at the house several times a week and attends many of

I have explained to them many times that not everyone that passes on is loved and missed by so many people. They were too young to remember the tributes given at the time of his death. I kept thinking the other night what a thrill that Robert would have had to know that his kids were playing with the kids of the brothers that he grew up with in college. We can not thank you enough."
