

Elmhurst Recognized For Design Achievements

Dan Elmhurst '96 is a Circuit Design Engineer with Intel Corporation in Folsom, CA and the recipient of the first Eaton Award in Design Excellence given by Purdue's School of Electrical Engineering. This award recognized Dan's key role in two major Intel projects -the Intel Firmware Hub security chip and and the 1.8-volt Dual-Plane Flash Memory program. Dan's achievements have led him to be named the youngest member of the research and development team for the Flash Products Group's next process generation design.

Dan returned to Purdue to accept the Eaton Award on March 8 and spoke to a student convocation on his work. While in town, Dan returned to 202 Littleton Street for lunch and a chance to visit with some of the brothers in the house. Dan commented that he was impressed with the brothers and the chapter house and that "the spirit of Sigma Chi was alive in the house and the brothers".

ROSE BOWL HOSTS MANY, MANY DELTA DELTA BROTHERS


Everywhere you turned it seemed that you would run into a Delta Delta brother as the Sigs turned out in large numbers to cheer on the Boil-

Purdue Sigma Chi Pledges Perform Random Act of Kindness

On a sunny Saturday morning last October, in West Lafayette, Indiana, three Purdue freshmen girls and a friend from high school were on the hunt for some Fruity Pebbles breakfast cereal. Because there was no food service at their dorm, they pulled sweat-shirts on over their pajamas and piled into their high school friend's car to make a trip of several blocks to another dorm, where they thought they might find the elusive Fruity Pebbles. A block or so from their destination, they paused at a four-way stop and then proceeded into the intersection, where they were t-boned by a man driving a large Dodge Ram pickup truck traveling at an estimated speed of nearly 50 mph.

The driver of the car, Sabrina Kuderly, and the front-seat passenger, Purdue freshman Lillian Bartlett, were shaken up but had no visible injuries. The girls in the backseat, Purdue freshmen Megan DeMars and Andi Keenan, were not so lucky. The truck struck the car at the right rear passenger door, where Megan was sitting. The impact threw her across the car and into Andi, whose head was pushed through the left rear passenger window.

When the accident occurred, Paul Jackson, Purdue freshman and Sigma Chi pledge, was on his way to the Sigma Chi house by bicycle. He saw the accident and rushed to help. As Andi was helped from the car, Paul knelt by her, took off his shirt, and used it to apply pressure to her forehead, which was bleeding profusely. Within minutes, two ambulances arrived to transport the girls to the hospital.

Sabrina was examined and immediately released. Lillian suffered a concussion and was held in the hospital until late that evening; she was shaken up and still very sore for a week or so. Megan was hospitalized for several days and, after a battery of diagnostic tests, was found to have broken her pelvis in two places. She eventually went home to Indianapolis and held on to the hope that she would be able to return and finish the semester, but that was not to be. In fact, she was not able to return to her first semester classes, and she faced back surgery in the Spring, so she was not even able to pick up her studies in what should have been her second semester. Andi, whose injuries were the most visible, needed several hundred stitches in her forehead, and she faces one or more further rounds of cosmetic surgery over the next year or so. Nevertheless, she was released the night of the accident and missed just one day of classes.

Unbeknownst to the girls, a Sigma Chi pledge brother of Paul's -- Chris Drewry – was dating Stephanie Irick, who lived across the hall from Andi, and they were cooking something up. On Friday afternoon, just six days after the accident, Andi and Lillian were told by their friends to be in Andi's room, all spiffed up, at 6:00 p.m. At 6:00 p.m., there was a knock on the door and, when Andi opened it, 26 Sigma Chi pledge brothers stood in the hall holding flowers and cards for the two girls. All 26 expressed their sympathy and told the girls that they were ready to help in any way, at any time. All they had to do was call.

I am Andi's father, and her mother and I want to personally and publicly thank each and every one of the young men who took the time to do something special for two girls who were hurt and discouraged. First, our thanks go to Paul Jackson, who knelt by our daughter to help and reassure her. Second, our thanks go to 26 young men, including Paul, who saw a chance to perform a random act of kindness and did. On a Friday in October, you represented yourselves and your fraternity well. Thank you.
