Cooper '68 Honored As Significant Sig

John L. Cooper '68 was recently named a Significant Sig for his contributions and accomplishments in the field of intellectual property, antitrust and commercial law.

John is the senior member and founder of Farella Braun & Martel LLP's Intellectual Property Litigation Group in San Francisco where he regularly represents technology companies in complex patent actions and in cases addressing the confluence of intellectual property and antitrust issues. Today John is recognized nationally as an authority in his field of practice and a leader in the patent bar.

Neon, Lightning Light Up Annual Golf Outing

Held on June 13th at Purdue's Kampen Golf Course, the Sig outing is the longest running alumni golf event by a Purdue fraternity. Started in 1990 it continues to bring brothers of all ages back for a fun day of golf and brotherhood.

The Class of '68 took top honors for the most brothers returning with 12. The Class of '77 with nine and the Class of '71 with eight brothers participating also made strong showings.

At the end of the rain shortened golf round there were three teams tied for first at 3 under par. The Classes of '95, '71 and '03 had to compete in a putt-off in the Great Hall to see who the first place team would be. Rick Taylor '95 knocked his putt within inches of the cup to claim top honors for his Class of '95 teammates, Craig Johnson and Eric Morgan.



Local NFF Executive Director Jim Vrugink noted, “Bart has provided great leadership for our chapter from its infancy in 2004 to become one of the largest NFF chapters in the country, helping Purdue get more former players into the College Football and Indiana Football Halls of Fame and providing scholarships of almost \$250,000 for more than 200 scholar-athletes.”

Bart was particularly happy to have helped his long time friend and Purdue football teammate Mark Herrmann '81 get inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. Along with Herrmann there was a large contingent of Sigma Chi’s in attendance at the annual NFF dinner held at the Purdue Memorial Union on June 10.

“I wanted to thank all the Sigma Chi’s for attending the NFF dinner last night,” wrote Bart the following day. “When I saw Butch (Brose '09) prior to the dinner I thought it was very nice of him to come and support the NFF. 
We would also like to thank all the brothers who have returned over the past 25 years to make this event special. We look forward to continuing this great tradition and the return of even more brothers in 2016.

A Remarkable Sigma Chi Life

Significant Sig Kenneth H. Kraft, Jr. '56 entered Chapter Eternal on April 16, 2015 at the age of 81 after an extended battle with cancer.

Brother Kraft throughout his life exemplified the ideals of our Fraternity and made significant contributions to Delta Delta, other Sigma Chi chapters, and the International Fraternity.

His remarkable life touched the lives of many and his kindness and generosity were always present. Ken's Delta Delta legacy can be seen through the scholarship established in his name for Delta Delta brothers, his financial contributions to the chapter house renovation and ongoing maintenance, the hundreds of hours spent compiling an accurate Consul's roster, and his willingness to answer the call whenever asked.

At Ken's funeral service his daughter, Kathy, spoke about Ken's love for

Sigma Chi and referenced the Jordan Standard. She eloquently gave examples of how Ken lived his life based on that standard. There was a beautiful array of white roses at the front of the church in the shape of the White Cross.

Ken graduated with a BS degree in Finance. At Purdue, Ken was in the Naval ROTC and served on the Interfraternity Council. At Delta Delta he served as its Magister, Pro Consul and Consul. Ken was a Life Loyal Sig and was named a Significant Sig in 2004.

Perhaps only Ken himself could sum up his life with Sigma Chi and Delta Delta as he spoke with Bernie Sergesketter and Jim Dora the day before his passing. At the end of the call, Ken simply said, "Goodbye dear brothers."
