Schreiber '86 To Lead Boilermaker Baseball Program

An official announcement was made on May 29 by Purdue's Athletic Department that Arizona State assistant coach Doug Schreiber $\triangle\triangle$ '86 has been hired to become the 19th head baseball coach in the program's 110-year history.

Doug was offered the position while the Sun Devils were participating in the College World Series being held in Omaha, NE. "I am tremendously honored and excited to come back... and am looking forward to again being a part of the tremendous academic and athletic reputation that Purdue has nationwide, and I'm anxious to get started," Doug said. Doug's strong background, experience, recruiting ability, and affinity for Purdue were given as reasons for his selection.

During Doug's days at Delta Delta he was a four-year starter at second base and earned second team All-Big Ten honors as a senior. He is Purdue's all-time leader in walks, and ranks third with 159 runs, third in games played (220), fifth in at-bats (700) and seventh in doubles (34).

Upon leaving Purdue Doug served as an assistant for three years at Butler and Ball State, and one year at Notre Dame. When Notre Dame's head coach moved to Arizona State, Doug See Schreiber . . . Page 6

Gateway To The West Hosts "Old Gold" Spring Formal




