Over 75 alumni returned to challenge Purdue's revamped Ackerman golf course with the foursome of Dave Richter '84, Greg Klug '85, Bryan Nikirk '84 and Jeff Wilson '84 taking home first place honors with a round of 11 under par. The winners were closely followed by the team of Jim MacDonald '80, R.L. Berry '80, Bob Marks '80, and Mike Spooner '80. ## Blinn '55 Leads Washington D.C. Alumni Chapter

Robert Blinn '55 is now the Washington Alumni Chapter President where he has the honor of working with over 5000 Sigs living in the greater Washington, DC area. Bob has served the alumni chapter over the past 20 years in various positions and is a Life Loyal Sig.

Bob noted that he has always loved Sigma Chi and often reflects on his Delta Delta pledging and initiation experience. He says that like many young freshman he was terribly immature with awful study habits. This led to early academic trouble and some social irresponsibility even though several Delta Delta upperclassmen took some dramatic steps to turn him around. According to Bob there efforts were to no avail and he left Purdue after two years in 1953 to join the Air Force. After a shaky start in the service, Bob stated that "he somehow recovered to make a good career and he retired from the Air Force in 1975 as a lieutenant colonel after See Blinn ... page 4
