## DELTA DELTA CELEBRATES 125 YEARS

"They arrived this weekend from eight different decades, 31 states and two foreign countries, gathering at one of the most historic fraternities on the Purdue University campus." So noted the Lafayette Journal and Courier as it covered Delta Delta's 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration weekend held June 9 - 11. This special weekend hosted almost 400 returning alumni who partook in dinners, golf, tours, workshops and the sharing of 125 years of Delta Delta brotherhood.

The big weekend kicked off on Friday with Significant Sigs Bernie Sergesketter, Bruce Harreld, Allen Menke, Chick Weaver, Keith Krach, Greg Harbaugh and Ralph Weiger, conducting an undergraduate workshop. This activity was coordinated by Brad Nihls '99 and gave the undergraduates a chance to interact with these men and learn more about those traits and qualities that build our future leaders.

Friday evening the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary reception and banquet was held at the Purdue Memorial Union. Purdue Athletic Director Morgan Burke joined us for the reception and gave us all a Boilermaker sports update. The banquet served

### The Quest of the Sigma Chi Crest -- A 39 Year Journey

This is a story about a journey. A journey that began 39 years ago, one that has covered 2370 miles by car, truck and air. A journey paved with good intentions. A journey that represented in its own way the ongoing quest of one man to find the White Cross and fulfill a promise he made to the chapter 39 years earlier. So began Nick Fritsch's '64 remarkable story that captured the hearts of the 300 guests at the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration banquet.


Following the Blue Formal dance in 1960, a fire started in the decorations on the balcony and swept to the "blue sky" adornments above the Great Hall. The Great Hall, Game Room and Library were moderately damaged. Many items of chapter memorabilia were scorched, including the crest of Sigma Chi. As the restoration of the chapter house neared completion, Nick promised chapter advisor, Cordy Hall, that he would repair the crest's broken and blistered wood over the summer of 1961. Summer ended with Nick earning enough money to return to Purdue and the crest untouched. He had realized that he, not only did not have the tools to do a first class job. he did not have the woodworking skills. The summers rolled on, and three weeks after graduation, Nick was on active duty.

Life continued for Nick after the Army – starting a career, wedding, children and more Army in the Reserves. Upon retirement in 1998 and the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration looming, Nick stated he was "out of excuses". On a Christmas holiday visit to Indianapolis Nick

finally found a lumbervard could do the necessary millwork. He had them create a new walnut backboard for the crest. Now he had to restore the brass, scroll, Norman Shield and the eagle from 39 years of tarnish, corrosion and rust. Nick spent dozens of hours using sandpaper, crocus cloth and At the end of.

most days, Nick would have to stop for a day to give his fingertips time to heal. Four coats of white paint, mixed with just the "right" shade of blue, four coats of satin finish applied to the wood base, and very carefully mounting the crest to the base, eventually yielded the first class results that he had envisioned 39 years ago.


At the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary banquet Nick presented the chapter with the

refurbished crest. In his comments he related how the journey of the crest reminded him of a quest that he had taken 39 years ago prior to his initiation. As he held the crest high above his head, the applause was thunderous. His commitment as a pledge 39 years earlier had been fulfilled. His journey and quest complete.

Today Nick is retired and lives in Sand Key, Florida.

Keith Krach '79, the 1978-1979 International Balfour winner, served as the evening's master of ceremonies. During the evening we had a chance to hear from Keith as he spoke about the roll Sigma Chi and Delta Delta have played in his life and in his business success. Past Grand Consul Dick Hester spoke about the importance of Sigma Chi today and presented Allen Menke '44 with the Order of Constantine.

Jeff McKean recognized current and former House Corporation members, Chapter Advisors, Consuls and Balfour nominees. A special moment came as Tom Leslie '68 conducted the roll call of Sigs based on their initiation dates. As Tom asked those brothers to sit that had been Sigs less than 10, 20, 25, 35, 45, and 50 years, the applause grew as 14 brothers, who had been Sigs 50 years or more, received a white rose and a standing tribute.

In addition, Brother Menke is the only member of our chapter to receive the Order of Constantine and also have been named The Order of a Significant Sig. Constantine is presented to individuals that have made long standing, continuous, and significant contributions to Sigma Chi. At the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration banquet past Grand Consul Richard Hester presented Allen with this tribute on behalf of the Inter-



national Fraternity. Brother Hester noted that Allen's long term service to the Sigma Chi Foundation, where he currently serves as Treasurer and sits on the Board of Governors, and his many other contributions to Sigma Chi, had been done quietly and effectively in "a manner the Seven Founders would have commended." Congratulations Brother Menke!!

Also called upon were former Purdue quarterback and coach Bob De-Moss '50, 1979-1980 International Balfour winner Tim Palmer '80, basketball All American Dave Schellhase '66, former Purdue star receiver Bart Burrell '81 and current Purdue quarterback and Heisman candidate Drew Brees '01. Just as this auspicious group thought their portion of the program was finished, the "weasel" siren sounded and former consul Gavin Philipps '95 raced to the stage to conduct an impromptu firedrill. Under the friendly grilling of Brother Philipps we learned just how little of Delta Delta's history they recalled. But with the help of the crowd each question was answered as we walked through the history of our chapter. Our notable guests left the stage using the

"chain of brotherhood" and smiling to the applause of all.

The restoration and return of the chapter crest by Nick Fritch '64 (see story Page 3), reminded us that our quest for the White Cross took many forms and was something each of us in our own way would continue to seek throughout our lives. The evening came to a fitting close as Brothers Kurt Vahle '58, Tom Schneider '77, John Pierce '80, and Doug Wilton '63, led us all in stirring renditions of our favorite Sigma Chi songs.
