Mead Earns Lifetime Achievement Award

David Mead '52 was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award by the Twin Falls, Idaho Area Chamber of Commerce in 1999. This recognition was given for over 40 years of leadership to his community and the state of Idaho. March 2000 Dave found his background in agriculture and natural resources called upon to represent his community in hearings before the U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate as the U.S. Forest sought to increase the fees paid by individuals who had built vacation homes on national forest land. Through Dave's efforts Congress passed legislation to slow the fee increases.

In addition Dave was chairman and founder of the Twin Falls Public Library Foundation, served in over three dozen local and statewide positions on important boards and projects like chairman of the State Health and Welfare Board, Parks & Recreation, Canyon Advisory, Boy Scouts, and Civic Auditorium Association.
