The International Fraternity announced in March that Delta Delta brothers Joe Kelly '66 and Mark Sand '73 have been honored as Significant Sigs. Their individual accomplishments in their professional fields and their generosity and leadership roles in helping others, made them very worthy recipients.

Joe Kelly '66 was recognized for his remarkable career as Chairman and President of Kelly and Associates, a Boulder, CO, management consulting firm which he started in 1977. Over the years Joe has simultaneously held Board positions and served as President or Vice-President of numerous companies including Vac-Tec Systems Inc, Startek Inc, Colorado Golf and Turf Inc, American-Canadian Distribu-

tion Centers Inc, Rockies Global Marketing dba Steelmax, National Tube Company, and Tint America Inc.

Brother Kelly has also found time to stay involved with Purdue and Sigma Chi in Boulder where he has been Chapter Advisor and on the House Corporation. Joe has served as Vice President of the Kenneth King Foundation which assists the poor in Colorado. 

For the fourth year in a row Delta Delta participated in Drew Brees' '01 Rebuilding Through Brotherhood event that unites Sigma Chi brothers from across the United States and Canada. The Brees Dream Foundation partnered with the Krach Family Foundation for the first time this year to help Habitat For Humanity rebuild homes in the Upper 9th Ward community of New Orleans.

112 Sigma Chi's from four different chapters took part in this year's Rebuilding Through Brotherhood event. Delta Delta led the way with 52 brothers traveling from West Lafayette for a full week of hard labor and a great deal of fun. Other chapters that participated were Ball State University, Butler University, and Canada's Western Ontario University.


community. On and off the job site, we formed a special brotherhood bond with the other chapters.

Norm Banas '53 Life Loyal Sig, Life Time Contributor

Norm Banas, who entered Chapter Eternal on March 2 at the age of 78, was a sports legend in Hammond, Indiana and an inspiration to his many friends. A 1949 graduate of Clark High School in Hammond, he made All State in basketball and baseball and went on to play baseball, football and basketball at Purdue where he was captain of the baseball team where he played centerfield and one season led the Big Ten in triples. Norm was the MVP of the team in 1953. On the football field he was an end and kicker. In 1994 Brother Banas was selected as a member of the Hammond Sports Hall of Fame.

Norm gave much of his time and energy back to the community in which he grew up. After a stint in the Navy he returned to teach and coach for the next 34 years at Clark and Gavit High Schools in the Hammond School System.

At the time of Brother Banas' death, his neighbors wrote a letter of thanks

for all his years of friendship. "You'll always be an inspiration in our hearts and souls," it read. Brother Banas, a Life Loyal Sig, is survived by his sweetheart, Ruth, of 51 years, four children and many, many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Carmel Connection Joins Indiana Hall of Fame

The Carmel Connection that thrilled so many on the Purdue gridiron from 1977 to 1980 was recently honored by the Indiana Football Hall of Fame. Delta Delta brothers, Mark Herrmann '81 and Bart Burrell '81 were inducted together into the 2010 class of honorees on June 17 in a ceremony held in Indianapolis. Playing together both at Carmel High School and Purdue, Herrmann and Burrell set numerous records at both the high school and collegiate levels.




Bart Burrell '81 and Mark Herrmann '81

Burrell, a wide receiver, set the career receptions mark at Carmel H.S. with 97 catches, and at Purdue he left as their second all-time leading receiver with 2,126 receiving yards, 140 receptions and 14 touchdowns. Bart was first team All-State in 1976 and a member of the Boilermaker

teams that won three consecutive bowl games where he scored at least one touchdown in each game.

Herrmann, following his stellar high school career as a two time All-State quarterback, moved on to Purdue where he set nine NCAA passing records and Purdue career marks of 9,946 yards passing and 71 career touchdown passes. In each of the three bowl games Purdue played in during Mark's career, he was selected MVP of each. His senior year Mark was selected All Big Ten Conference, Big Ten Conference MVP, a consensus All American, and finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy balloting. Mark had an 11 year NFL career playing for the Denver Broncos, San Diego Chargers, Los Angeles Rams, and Indianapolis Colts.

In receiving their awards both Burrell and Herrmann thanked all those who had coached and supported them during their playing days, including their Delta Delta brothers. Sigs attending the Induction Ceremony were Bob Burlas, Tim Hull, Lee Sterry, Corby Thompson, Jim Reis, Jeff McKean, Jim Vruggink, Tom Leslie, Brady Herrmann and Phil Steele.
