Sigs Take Top Honors at Annual Greek Gala

Each year at the Interfratemity Council and Panhellenic Association Greek Gala awards presentations they recognize the top fratemity and sorority leaders, scholars and chapters.

At this year's event Delta Delta brothers were recognized as IFC Scholar of the Year and Chapter President of the Year. In addition the entire chapter was presented the R.B. Stewart Award as the outstanding fraternity on campus for 2013-2014.

Cagnassola Top Scholar

Andrew Cagnassola '15, a first year pharmacy student, was honored as IFC Scholar of the Year because of his strong academic performance and involvement in several campus groups. Drew presently has a 4.0 GPA in Pharmacy School and an overall 3.94 GPA when you include his pre-pharmacy classes.

Drew served as Delta Delta's academic chairman, and is involved in the Industrial Pharmacy Club, College Mentors for Kids, Association for Student Pharmacists and a volunteer for Habitat for Humanity and Lafayette Transitional Housing.

Greg noted, "It means a great deal to me for Delta Delta to receive three of the six awards this year. It not only



With so many brothers participating in different campus organizations Delta Delta maintained a very high profile on campus. With Delta Delta's increased efforts in philanthropy (ranked 2nd in philanthropy dollars raised and 3rd in community service hours completed), its strong academic performance (chapter GPA over 3.0 for first time), and several high profile alumni events, Delta Delta was selected Purdue's outstanding fraternity this past academic year.
