Delta Delta Responds to COVID 19

Under the Protect Purdue Pledge over 40,000 students returned to Purdue's campus starting the week of August 17 with classes beginning August 24th. Delta Delta opened its doors on August 19 to begin the move in process for the returning brothers. A move-in schedule was followed that spread out the arrival of the brothers so there was less congestion and fewer people at the house at any one time.

Our undergraduate brothers returned to their home away from home after leaving abruptly last March. Over the summer the House Corporation led by Tom Hall '81, working closely with Butch Brose (Maintenance Director), Todd Kaminski '80 and Treasurer Chris Horney, created a Delta Delta COVID Plan to support the active chapter and provide some of the necessary items dictated by Purdue. Todd also donated PPE items to be used if a brother tests positive for the virus.

This included providing masks and hand sanitizer; rethinking how meals would be served; modifying sleeping arrangements; providing a quarantine area within the chapter house; and arranging for public rooms and bathrooms to be cleaned professionally six days a week.

Tom Canfield '66 has had a long career of personal business success and supporting the development and funding of entrepreneurs in the Pittsburgh, PA area. He has also made significant contributions to the Pittsburgh community.

Brother Canfield earned an electrical

engineering degree from Purdue University and an MBA from the Harvard Business School. Early in his career, while an engineer in the U.S. Pub-Health Service, Tom

was Director of Strategic Planning for the Office of Solid Waste Management a part of the EPA.

Consul's Corner David Kratzman '21

I hope all are staying safe and healthy during these unprecedented times! The undergraduates were lucky enough to be back on campus this Fall to attend a combination of in-person and online classes, and the Executive Team and House Corporation have been working hard all summer to ensure that the chapter house could open safely!

Purdue has implemented the Protect Purdue Pledge and a set of Protect Purdue Guidelines such as wearing masks, social distancing, and random COVID-19 tests each week for the student body to take part in. The University also put together a facility very quickly to test students on campus and get results back to these students in 48 hours or less. In addition to this oncampus testing, each student was required to complete an in home test prior to returning to Purdue.

Throughout the summer, the undergraduate Executive Team worked closely with the House Corporation and our Advisors to develop a reopening plan for the Sigma Chi House. One of the biggest changes that we had was the implementation of the COVID-19 quarantine area inside the facili-The bathrooms have been David Kratzman '21. designated as the Sig-

ma Chi quarantine area. Temporary tables, chairs and bunks have been placed in the Eldridge room for brothers that are required to isolate, and even a temporary shower has been installed in one of the first floor bathrooms. Hand sanitizer stations throughout the house and daily temperature checks of all of the brothers are some of the other ways that we are preventing the spread of the virus among the 56 brothers living in the house.

This year, rush was conducted through a combination of online Zoom and 1-1 in-person meetings with the Potential New Members. We also held a summer rush event with 15 guests joining us in July. We gave out 34 bids with 31 acceptances.

We had an impressive 20+ brothers achieve a 4.0 GPA in the Spring 2020 semester, and we hope to continue that momentum this semester academically.

Nearly every active brother is still participating in multiple extracurricular activities including College Mentors for Kids, Global Engineering Bri-

While at Enterprise, Tom founded the Western Pennsylvania Adventure Capital Fund and the Pittsburgh Investor Network. From 1998 to 2001 the two organizations invested in over 25 local companies, attracting over \$100 million of added capital.

Brother Canfield was instrumental in establishing the Stop Now and Plan program in Pittsburgh. This program teaches boys and girls to think before they act and develops anger management and coping skills to minimize juvenile offenses.

Significant Brothers Enter Chapter Eternal

Robert "Bob" Elsperman '58, former CEO of Tarlton Corporation, the construction company behind some

of the St. Louis region's biggest projects, entered Chapter Eternal on April 7 from complications of COVID-19. Brother Elsperman was 83.

As a member of one of Delta Delta's most dedicated pledge

classes, the Class of '58, Brother Elsperman was an avid supporter of our chapter. He took an active, but often low profile role, in some of Delta Delta's biggest projects including the 2007 chapter house renovation which he helped initiate with Bernie Sergesketter and Jim Dora. He also lent his support when we built the Grand Prix garage. Bob was personally responsible for providing the funding and inspiration behind placing the EX letters on the chimney on the east side of the chapter house.

Recognized as a Significant Sig for his contributions to his industry and the St. Louis community, Bob was also honored by Purdue in 2014 with the Civil Engineering Alumni Achievement Award.

Bob married his lifetime sweetheart D'Arcy in 1960. Together they raised their family and contributed significantly to the St. Louis community.

Gerald D. Hines '46, one of Delta Delta's most supportive benefactors, entered Chapter Eternal on August 23 at the age of 95.

Brother Hines was recognized as a Significant Sig in 1979 and was inducted into the Sigma Chi Hall of Fame at the Fraternity's 150th celebration in 2005.

An acknowledged visionary developer, Brother Hines was founder and chairman of Hines, a global real estate development company. Under his direction Hines completed 907 projects, including more than 100 buildings over 25 stories tall.

Brother Hines was often the quiet inspiration behind Sigma Chi reunions of his fellow Greatest Generation alumni brothers, as well as a major contributor to Delta Delta renovation campaigns in 1988 and 2007. The dining room in the Sig house is named in his honor.

Gerald will be remembered as a modest man with a big heart who touched many lives with his signature humility, generosity, humor and grace. Brother Hines is survived by his sweetheart Barbara, his four children, 15 grandchildren, 13 nieces and nephews and one greatgrandson.

Dan Curtis '55 Member National Self Storage Hall of Fame

Dan Curtis earned a place in the National Self-Storage Industry's Hall of Fame as one of the first seven pioneers in the self-storage industry.

Brother Curtis helped found the Association in 1975 which now represents a global industry with 42,000 self-storage facilities and members in 27 countries.

Vruggink Receives Lifetime Achievement Award

Long time Delta Delta Faculty Advisor, Jim Vruggink, has been recognized for his career contributions to intercollegiate sports with the **2020 CoSIDA Lifetime Achievement Award**. Jim was inducted into the CoSIDA (Collegiate Sports Information Directors Association) Hall of Fame in 2004 and served as president of the organization in 1996-97.

Brother Vruggink came to Purdue in 1982 as sports information director. He became athletic public relations director in 1986 and then served as director of special projects from 2001 until his retirement in 2019. In his 37 year

career at Purdue, topping his list of accomplishments was working with two-time Heisman Trophy finalist and future NFL Hall of Fame quarterback and Significant Sig Drew Brees '01. Jim and Drew maintain a close friendship to this day.

Other highlights included coordinating Heisman campaigns for quarter-back Significant Sig Jim Everett '85 in 1984 and fullback Mike Alstott in 1995. Vruggink also worked closely with Hall of Fame men's basketball coach Gene Keady and other Purdue icons David Boudia, Ryan Kerrigan, Glenn Robinson and Stephanie White.
