Brothers Honored at Special Chapter Event

Delta Delta has experienced many outstanding moments over the years. The Alumni Honors Dinner held on October 1, 2021, in the Great Hall was one more of these celebrated events. Five Significant Sigs and one Order of Constantine brother were presented their awards in a formal event hosting over 115 alumni, guests and undergraduates.

Significant Sig honoree Tom Canfield '66 remarked, "This was a great evening. I think the event gained from the number of honorees. It was impressive to see the span of time that Delta Delta has had so many outstanding brothers. I was really impressed to see the support from more than one pledge class for Scott Hutton."

Former Undersecretary of State, business entrepreneur, and 64th Grand Consul Keith Krach '79 set the stage with his opening remarks upon the completion of dinner. Brother Krach reminded all those present by Sigma Chi as undergraduates and the importance of trusting the ideals we learn as Sigma Chis.

Each of the five new Significant Sigs were then individually presented their plaques, certificates and pins by former Grand Consul Keith Krach after having their accomplishments read by Phil Steele. Those honored were Paul Kuhnert '65, Tom Canfield '66, Tom Morales '75, John Taylor '75 and Scott Hutton '94. Delta Delta has had 61 alumni selected as Significant Sigs. ter. On one occasion he spent several days at the chapter house restoring the chandelier lights in the Great Hall.

Ray valued and loved life. He loved the thrill of speed on his motorcycles and was often joined on bike rides by Russ Wunderlich. Bill Delaney '67 recalls, "During the summer of 1966, Ray rode his 750 Triumph motorcycle from Purdue to Los Angeles, a round trip of over 4,250 miles. On the return trip from L.A., Mike Massey and I drove Mike's Austin Healy while Ray rode his motorcycle, with high-rise handlebars. The three of us conservative engineering students were returning to our senior year at Purdue wearing traditional scraggly long beards. We looked like the cast of the movie, "Easy Rider". Our appearance made the small-town residents uneasy, and one restaurant even asked to leave! They mistook us for "California Hippies."

Ray's wife, Laurie, and their two daughters fulfilled Ray's final request by spreading his ashes across the front and back lawns at 202 Littleton. They also placed ashes at the spot where he always parked his motorcycle. When the task was completed, they enjoyed a bottle of champagne and celebrated LIFE! Ray will always be in our hearts and minds and remain with us forever at 202 Littleton Street.

Doug Streff '58, entered Chapter Eternal on December 12, 2021. Some of Doug's favorite stories

during his days at Purdue were playing football for the Boilers as the back-up quarterback to Lenny Dawson, who later led the Kansas City Chiefs to the 1970 Super Bowl title. Each week Doug quarterbacked

Along with football, Doug loved the theatre and performed in several student productions at Purdue. After graduation Doug was on active duty as an Officer in the Army for six months and then served for 7 years with pledge brother Don Trieschmann in the 349th Psywar Company Reserve Unit.

Doug began his career with the American Broadcasting Company (ABC) in network sales. He advanced to the level of Vice President and was responsible for sales in one-third of the country.

William "Bill" Crorey '72 passed away in Portland, OR on September 10, 2021. Bill was an active member of Sigma Chi Fraternity and a proud graduate of Purdue University.

At age 16, he obtained his private pilot license and then his pilot instructor's license, opening Crorey Aviation flight school. As a professional Engineer, he worked in Japan and Korea and later established Crorev Mechanical Engineering Company in Oregon City, OR. He invented and patented the gasifier technology used to recycle bio-waste into fuel. Bill had great work ethic, a strong faith, was generous and loved time spent with his family.

Brothers Cheer Boilers to Victory at Music City Bowl

Kuhnert remarked, "Describing the game as "good" would be an understatement; it was like no game we had ever seen before. It had big plays, controversial penalties, and a "never-say-die" attitude by both teams. Cheering and screaming occurred almost non-stop during the game. Shouts of "Boilerup" and "Hail Purdue" rang out in the hotel hallways and walking down the street. (Bob and I cheered enough for our entire Pledge Class!) The announcer estimated the attendance to be over 69,400 fans."

According to Brother Smith, "There was a lot of high-fiving going on followed by groans when the Vols scored followed by more celebration when Purdue fought back. It was an exciting game of ups and downs reminiscent of "exercising" in the Great Hall." In a record-setting Mu-

sic City Bowl, Purdue overcame a 14-point deficit and beat Tennessee 48-45 when Mitchell Fineran kicked a 39-yard field goal in overtime. This year's Boilermaker football team compiled its best record since 2003 and tied for the second-most wins (9-4) in the history of Purdue football. It was only the 12th Purdue team to win nine games. They also won their fifth game away from home, last accomplished in 1943.

The post-game dinner was held at the famous-for-BBQ Caney Forked River Grille. A lot of other Purdue fans were there and acknowledged our hats and sweatshirts with greetings of "Boiler Up" and "Go Purdue!" Brother Kuhnert showed up in a vintage 1961 sweatshirt with a never-before-known-to-exist Purdue Pete design, while Brother Smith was sporting a beard grown during the summer in Vermont. Overall it was a great day to be a Boilermaker.
