Three Significant Sigs and two other dedicated brothers were recognized for their professional achievements and contributions to Delta Delta at our recent Alumni Honors Dinner. Held in the Great Hall, this dinner was attended by over 50 alumni and guests and 40 undergraduates and pledges on September 15, 2023.

Consul David Kolssak '25 and House Corp President Tom Hall '81 welcomed those guests in attendance and following dinner Phil Steele '77 got the award presentations started.

Three Delta Delta brothers were honored with Significant Sig awards, David Omholt '92, Ed Quatmann '92 and Stan Jones '71.

Dave Omholt '92 was recognized for his work through his company, The

Entrepreneurial Authority, to help thousands of clients start their own franchise businesses. Scott Hutton '94 and Mark Singleton '92 both spoke about his accomplishments and his impact through his many activities to better his community and industry.

Ed Quatmann '92, now the the Chief Legal Officer of Ceasar's Entertainment, has found success throughout his career by working closely with his peers to implement change and provide opportunities for those within his organization. John McCall '92 and Mark Singleton '92 both relayed stories of how Ed's calm presence and demeanor from his days at Purdue to his business dealings today have always stood out.

Stan Jones '71 was awarded his Significant Sig award posthumously. Stan entered Chapter Eternal in February 2017 while still working throughout the country to improve opportunities for all children to attend college. Phil Steele '77 highlighted Stan's career accomplishments. The programs Stan developed as Indiana's Commissioner of Higher Education created numerous opportunities for all Indiana students to attain a college degree.

George Ade Sites Recognized as Sigma Chi Memorials

Hazelden, George Ade's home in Brook, Indiana, and his grave site in Kentland, Indiana, have been recognized as Sigma Chi memorials by Sigma Chi Fraternity.

The recognition of Hazelden and Ade's grave site signifies their importance as Sigma Chi-related historic sites. The historical significance of Ade's grave in Kentland reflects Ade's service to the National Fraternity as its 14th Grand Consul and his authorship of the Sigma Chi Creed. George Ade's headstone is one in a circle of family graves surrounding a central monument.

Ade's home Hazelden is on the National Registry of Historical Places, and its importance in Indiana history has been recognized by the Indiana Historical Bureau, which has placed memorial plaques on the grounds. A similar plaque is planned for Hazelden's designation as a Sigma Chi Historical Site noting Ade's contributions to the Fraternity and to the Delta Delta Chapter at Purdue, whose chapter house built in 1912, was largely funded by Ade.

This recognition was during a dinner held as Chi Memorial site. part of the 55th reunion celebration of the Class of 1968.

The evening at Hazelden was highlighted by the presentation of a framed announcement of the designation of Hazelden as a Sigma Chi Memorial. Robert Kaley '68, presented the certificate to Ms. Kristine Wright, the Chair of the

Brother Kaley was the sponsor of the applications for recognition for both Hazelden and Ade's grave site.

Tim reconnected with the chapter in the early 2000's when he moved back to West Lafayette. He became an active member of the House Corporation where he imparted to our undergraduate brothers some of the many lessons he learned as a brother in the house. His passion for maintaining the chapter house went beyond just expecting it to be clean. His goal was to instill a deep sense of pride in the place we all called home during our college years. In a way only Tim could do, he reminded the actives of the high standards they were expected to meet and of the life lessons acquired in doing this.

During the 2007 renovation campaign Tim took part in numerous "progress review" meetings with the contractor. He also made the arrangements for interim housing for the undergrads during the one year project.

Butch Brose '09 reflected, "It was 2007-8 that I had the honor and pleasure of getting to know Brother Tim Maloney as I began my tenure as Director of Maintenance for Sigma Chi. Tim's passion and dedication for Dear Old Delta Delta were easy to see, admire, and you might say conta-
