## Purdue Celebrates 150 Years of Greek Life

The Fraternity, Sorority and Cooperative Life community at Purdue (FSCL) celebrated 150 Years of Legacy at Purdue University on September 26 – 27, 2025, in West Lafayette. The weekend schedule of events included hosting an opening reception at the Sigma Chi chapter house Friday evening, September 26. With a number of distinguished guests and members of FSCL in attendance, it was a great way to highlight Delta Delta's early history and struggles to become Purdue's first fraternity founded on March 3, 1875, as well as host the event in our historic chapter house.

Brandon Cutler, Associate Dean of Students/Director of Fraternity, Sorority and Cooperative Life, thanked the Sigs for making their home available for this event. He also highlighted that total FSCL membership was 7,278 with 3,684 being in fraternities. That academically FSCL semester average grades were higher than the all-undergraduate average, and that FSCL members had higher retention and graduation rates than the overall Purdue undergraduate rates.

As part of this celebration FSCL solicited nominations from all its members and compiled a list of its 150 Most Influential Alumni based on their contributions and achievements since leaving Purdue. Sigma Chi was well represented as part of this illustrious group. Twenty-one Sigs were named as Most Influential Alumni giving Sigma Chi the most alumni of any fraternity or sorority to be recognized by FSCL.

## Sigs Unveil George Ade Memorial Plaque

At the ribbon cutting ceremony held for the restored gardens at George Ade's Hazelden home in Brook, IN, held on October 12, 2025, a group of Delta Delta alumni unveiled a plaque highlighting Ade's contributions to Sigma Chi Fraternity. Bob Kaley '68, who led the effort to obtain the plaque, made the presentation. He was joined by Tom Leslie '68, Brian Dawson '77 and Phil Steele '77. Brother Kaley remarked on Ade's life-long involvement with Sigma Chi and spoke about Ade's thoughts as he wrote the Sigma Chi Creed that was adopted by the Fraternity in 1929.

The Sigma Chi plaque was set near the bronze statue of George Ade in

the newly recreated Hazelden garden. The Indiana-shaped garden, a unique and symbolic feature of the original Hazelden landscape, has been carefully restored with support from community donors, a number of Delta Delta brothers, and a grant from the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority. The restoration marks the first completed phase in a broader effort to return the estate to its former grandeur. Hazelden has been recognized as a Sigma Chi National Historic Site.

### Honorary Sweetheart Recognized

The Class of '68 took this opportunity to recognize Krissy Wright, President of the George Ade Historic Preservation Commission, as an

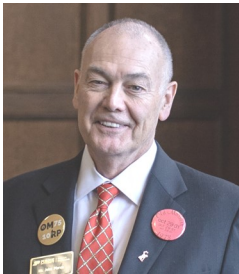

# Pierce '80 Returns To Delta Delta As Old Master

John Pierce '80 was one of five Old Masters who took part in the 2025 anniversary program celebrating the 75<sup>th</sup> year of Old Masters (OM) and the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Rising Professionals (RP) program held November 9 – 12, 2025. Old Masters engage with the Purdue student body by guest-speaking in classrooms, personally meeting with student organizations, and sharing some of their most valuable experiences in the campus-wide panel called *Echos of Excellence*.

As part of the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, the committee invited back all former OM's. One of those who returned was Greg Harbaugh '78, a 2004 Old Master. John noted, "It was nice having some quality time with one of my mentors, Greg Harbaugh, along with our wives. Both John and Greg, as undergrads, had been OM hosts and on the OM central committee.

John earned his B.S. in Economics from Purdue in 1980, followed by a J.D. from the University of Texas

School of Law in 1984. He is currently a white-collar criminal defense attorney at Liles Parker in Washington, D.C. John began his career in federal criminal law as an Assistant U.S. Attorney, serving for fourteen years across three offices: San Diego, Washington, D.C., and Alexandria, Virginia. For the first eleven years, he primarily prosecuted violent and organized crime, later shifting his focus to health care fraud during his final three years in public service.

In private practice for the last 25 years, John's focus is on defending doctors and other professionals in fraud investigations and prosecutions, although he occasionally represents those being prosecuted for violent or organized crimes.

John remarked, "Being selected as an OM was a real honor. Delta Delta has such a rich tradition of contributing to the success of OM. For

this year's program, I spoke in my three classroom sessions about the student's role in leadership. I used the values-based leadership taught at the Krach Transformational Leadership Training as the basis of my talks.

Wednesday afternoon included a visit to 202 where John answered the brother's questions, discussed his career, and took the time to extol the virtues of the leadership training available through Sigma Chi and the importance of taking full advantage of these opportunities.

## Sigs Serve Others in Highlands of Guatemala

Fifteen undergraduate brothers took part in a mission trip over winter break to Antigua, Guatemala. Partnering with the International Esperanza Project the Sigs performed service work for families in the community of Chimaltenango, Guatemala. The six-day trip included multiple days of hands-on mission work, as well as opportunities for team building, Bible study, personal growth, and a climb of Volcán San Pedro, a nearly 10,000-foot stratovolcano in Southern Guatemala.

The group was hosted by Phil Lamport '97 and Manny Ayau '02, who both live in Guatemala, and accompanied by Jay Andrew '98. Led by Nathan Blied '27 the undergrads spent the first day learning how to put together stoves that ran off of wood and were much more efficient than cooking over an open flame. Over the next two days they assembled and installed 48 stoves and 30+ water filters in two separate communities. In these communities, homes were without plumbing, HVAC, and often did not have electricity. Some of the homes were constructed of mud and sticks and the majority had dirt floors. Despite this, the group witnessed the immense joy of the locals who were grateful for everything and had a strong faith in God.

Phil Lamport remarked, "I believe that building high-efficiency wood-burning stoves for families in the highlands of Guatemala carries significant and lasting benefits. The families who receive the stoves no longer have to spend as much time gathering firewood, and their homes are no longer filled with smoke from open fires, which has a real impact on their health. At the same time, the undergrads get to see firsthand what life is like in rural Guatemala—places with dirt roads and no running water—yet places where people go about their day with dignity and warmth. Personally, visiting these communities gives me a profound sense of grati-

tude and reinforces how meaningful it can be to apply our time and effort in a way that genuinely improves someone else's daily life."

"Looking back on the experience," noted Phil, "I am convinced that trips like this can play a meaningful role in the life of the chapter. They are not meant to replace any part of the active experience, but rather to complement it by offering a shared challenge, a broader perspective, and time together away from campus. If this trip helped strengthen bonds among the actives and left them with a deeper sense of gratitude and responsibility, then it accomplished exactly what I had hoped for."



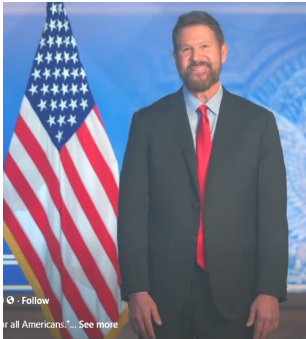
